

**ORDER NO. 01-04-08**

**OCCUPANCY AND USE**

**ANGELES NATIONAL FOREST**

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(a) and (b), and because of the high fire danger, the following acts are prohibited within the Angeles National Forest. This order is in effect from September 27, 2004 through the end of the official fire season.

1. Going into or being upon any area within the Angeles National Forest, except for those areas one/eighth of a mile from the following State or County roads:
  - a. Angeles Crest Highway (State Route 2).
  - b. State Route 39.
  - c. Interstate Route 5.
  - d. Mt Baldy Road.
  - e. East Fork Road from its intersection with State Route 39, then east to its intersection with the Glendora Mountain Road.
  - f. Big Pines Highway from the boundary of the Angeles National Forest, then east to its intersection with State Route 2.
  - g. Angeles Forest Highway from the boundary of the Angeles National Forest, then south to its intersection with State Route 2.
  - h. Mt Emma Road from the boundary of the Angeles National Forest, then southwest to its intersection with the Angeles Forest Highway.
  - i. Little Rock Creek Road from the boundary of the Angeles National Forest, then south to the gate just north of the Santiago Canyon Day Use Area.
  - j. Big Tujunga Canyon Road from the boundary of the Angeles National Forest, then east to its intersection with the Angeles Forest Highway.
  - k. Upper Big Tujunga Canyon Road from its intersection with the Angeles Forest Highway, then east to its intersection with State Route 2.
  - l. Little Tujunga Canyon/Sand Canyon Road.
  - m. Bouquet Canyon Road.
  - n. San Fransisquito Canyon Road.
  - o. Lake Hughes/Elizabeth Lake Road.
  - p. Spunky Canyon Road.
  - q. Pine Canyon Road.
  - r. Smokey Bear Road.
  - s. Soledad Canyon Road.
  - t. Aliso Canyon Road.

- b. Being on any National Forest System road. 36 CFR 261.54(e).
- c. Being on any National Forest System trail. 36 CFR 261.55(a).

Pursuant to 36 CFR 261.50(e), the following persons are exempt from this order:

1. Owners or lessees of land within the closure area are exempt from the prohibitions listed above to the extent necessary to gain access to their land.
2. Persons with a permit from the Forest Service specifically authorizing the otherwise prohibited act.
3. Any Federal, State or local officer, or member of an organized rescue or firefighting force in the performance of an official duty.
